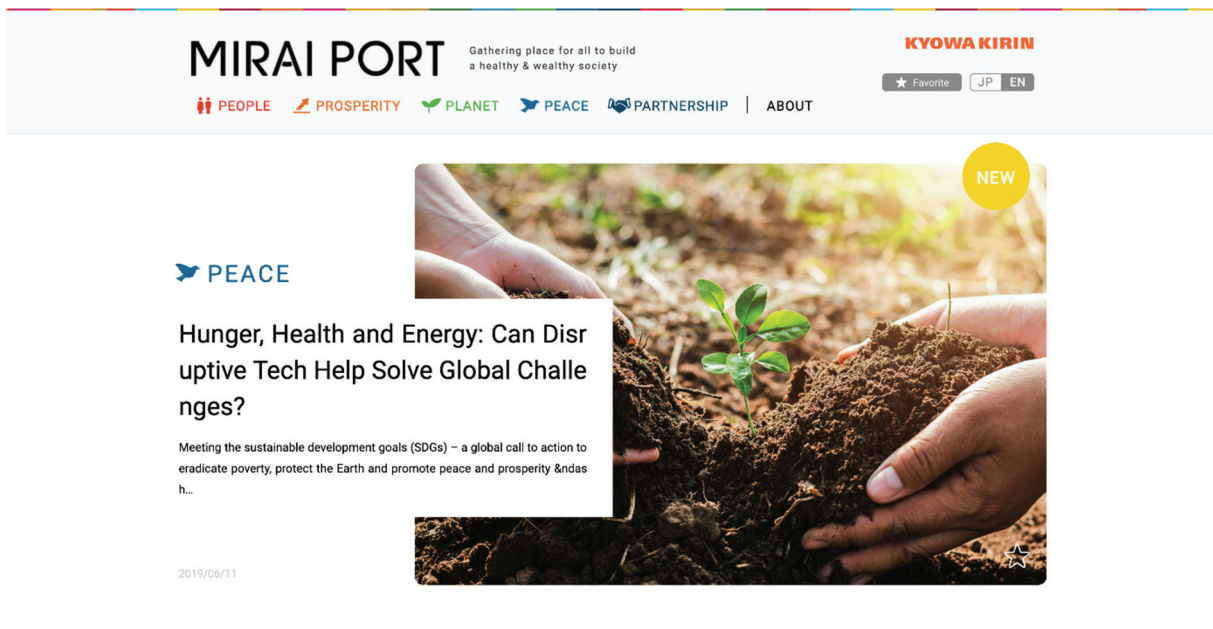


## For a World with Better Health and Well-beings Kyowa Hakko Kirin Brand Content *Mirai Port* Launched
